In this year-long program, students entering grades 9 through 12 work with Museum educators to facilitate family programs and special projects while exploring art and culture through the Museum's collections. After participating in a training program in spring of 2016, interns will begin volunteering in the fall for a minimum of three Sundays each semester engaging families with hands-on art activities, preparing materials for upcoming programs, and reading stories in the Museum's galleries.

Training Sessions

All Teen Interns will attend mandatory training sessions throughout the academic year to familiarize them with the Museum's special and permanent exhibitions. Interns will also learn about museum education, working with children, acquiring leadership skills, and engaging with works of art. Applicants must commit to four orientation trainings in the spring of 2016.

Community Service Hours

After completing a year of training sessions and volunteering, Teen Interns will receive community service hours for school.

To Apply

All applicants must submit an application form and one letter of recommendation from a teacher, coach, guidance counselor, supervisor, or camp counselor. All materials must be submitted by the deadline: **March 25, 2016**. To apply, please submit materials via mail, fax, or email them to:
