**The Arcades: Contemporary

The exhibition draws inspiration from an unfinished masterpiece by Walter Benjamin, the influential German-Jewish philosopher and cultural critic. Works by contemporary artists, in media ranging from photography and video to sculpture and painting, are paired with the 36 themes explored by Benjamin in his magnum opus, *The Arcades Project*.



**Charlemagne Palestine's  
Bear Mitzvah in  
Meshugahland**

Through August 6, 2017

Enter the colorful, fantastical world of visual artist, musician, composer, and performer Charlemagne Palestine. The immersive, site-specific installation of hundreds of teddy bears and other plush toys is influenced by the artist's Brooklyn Jewish roots. The toys — objects either found or handmade by the artist — are displayed on the gallery's floor and walls, suspended from the ceiling, and perched on pedestals.

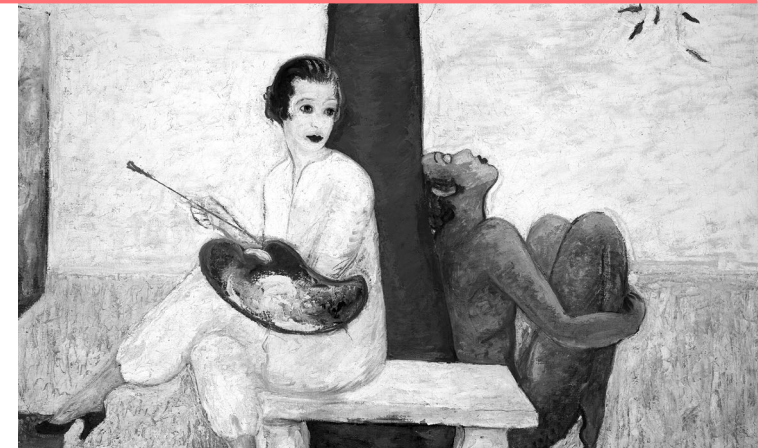
